Adult says the word slowly, stretching each sound.
Mmm-aaa-p.

Kid puts a sound tile in a box for each sound they hear.

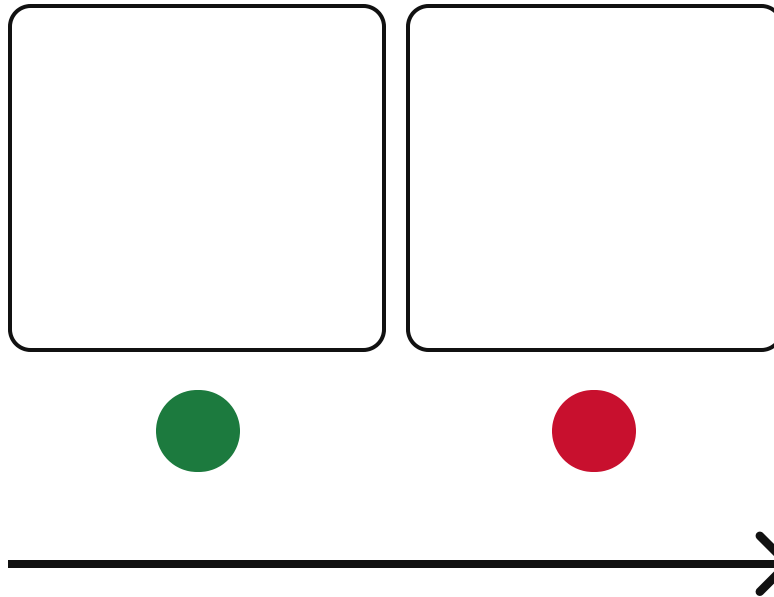
Kid touches each dot and says that sound on its own.

Kid sweeps along the arrow and blends the sounds.

5

Kid takes the tiles off and writes the word, saying each sound.

Words like cat, ship, duck, rain, bike, top.

1

Adult says the word slowly, stretching each sound. Mmm-aaa-p.

2

Kid puts a sound tile in a box for each sound they hear.

3

Kid touches each dot and says that sound on its own.

4

Kid sweeps along the arrow and blends the sounds.

5

Kid takes the tiles off and writes the word, saying each sound.

Words like frog, hand, lunch, sleep, desk, train.

Adult says the word slowly, stretching each sound.
Mmm-aaa-p.

Kid puts a sound tile in a box for each sound they hear.

Kid touches each dot and says that sound on its own.

Kid sweeps along the arrow and blends the sounds.

5

Kid takes the tiles off and writes the word, saying each sound.

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Elkonin Sound Boxes: 5 Sounds

Words like blend, stamp, crust, splash, string.

Adult says the word slowly, stretching each sound. Mmm-aaa-p.

2

Kid puts a sound tile in a box for each sound they hear.

3

Kid touches each dot and says that sound on its own.

4

Kid sweeps along the arrow and blends the sounds.

5

Kid takes the tiles off and writes the word, saying each sound.

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Elkonin Sound Boxes: Magic e

Words like mine, cake, home, cute. The e at the end makes no sound — it is why the vowel says its name.

Adult says the word slowly, stretching each sound.
Mmm-aaa-p.

2

Kid puts a sound tile in a box for each sound they hear.

Kid touches each dot and says that sound on its own.

4

Kid sweeps along the arrow and blends the sounds.

5

Kid takes the tiles off and writes the word, saying each sound.

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Sound Tiles: Consonants & Vowels

Start here — for most children this is the only tile page you need. Cut along the dotted lines. Each tile is ONE sound, so it goes in ONE box.

✂ **Consonants** There is no q tile — q never works alone. Use qu.

✂ **Vowels** Each spells a short sound and a long one. y is with the consonants — it does both jobs.

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Sound Tiles: Letter Teams

For when your child meets ship, chin, duck and well. Cut along the dotted lines.
Every tile here is two or three letters spelling a SINGLE sound — one box, never two.

✂ **Double letters** Two letters, still one sound — one box.

✂ **Two letters, one sound** These never split across two boxes.

✂ **Silent partners** The first letter is silent; the pair spells one sound.

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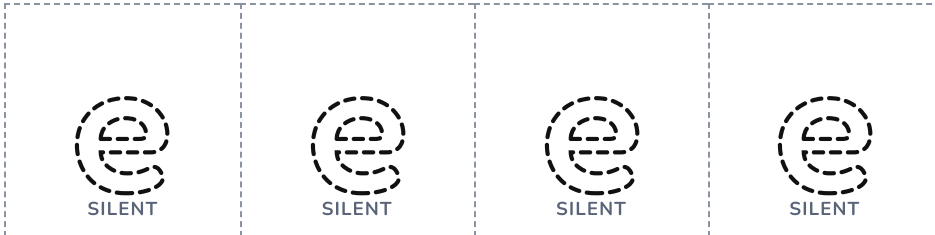


Sound Tiles: Vowel Teams

For rain, boat, night and blue. Cut along the dotted lines. A vowel team is one sound and takes one box; the dotted e is the magic e — it goes on the line, never in a box.

✂ **Magic e** Dotted because it is silent. It goes on the line, never in a box.



✂ **Vowel teams** Two or more letters, one vowel sound, one box.

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Sound Tiles: Bossy R

For car, bird, chair and store. Cut along the dotted lines. The r changes the vowel in front of it, so they share one box.

✂ **Bossy r** The r changes the vowel. are and ore keep their silent e.

✂ **In longer words** ti, ci, si spell /sh/ — station, special, pension.

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✂ **Counters** For the stage before letters — one counter per sound. Colour them in before you cut.

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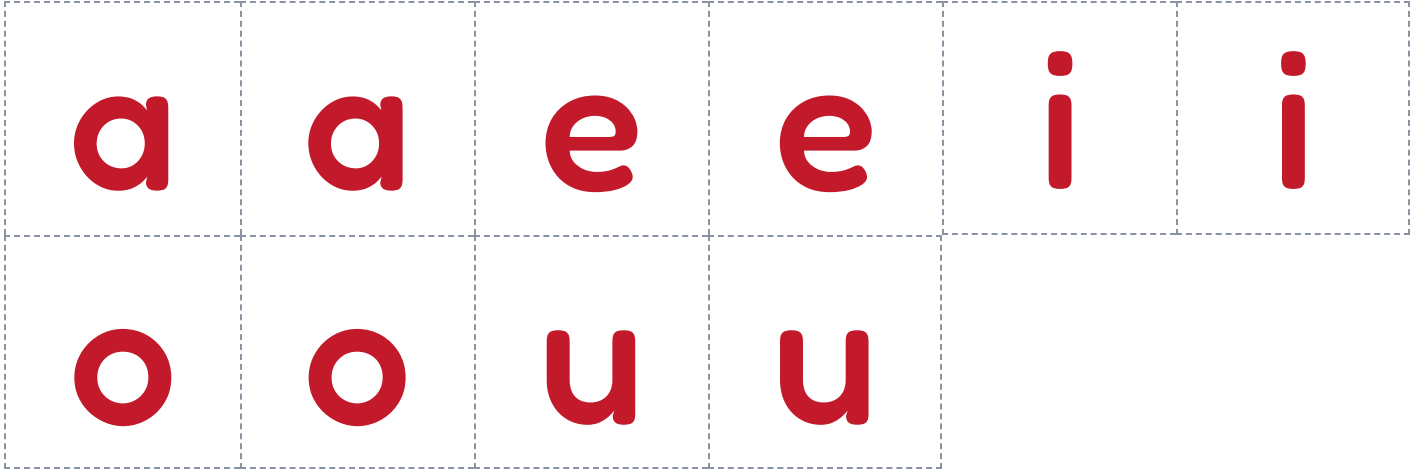


Sound Tiles: Extra Copies

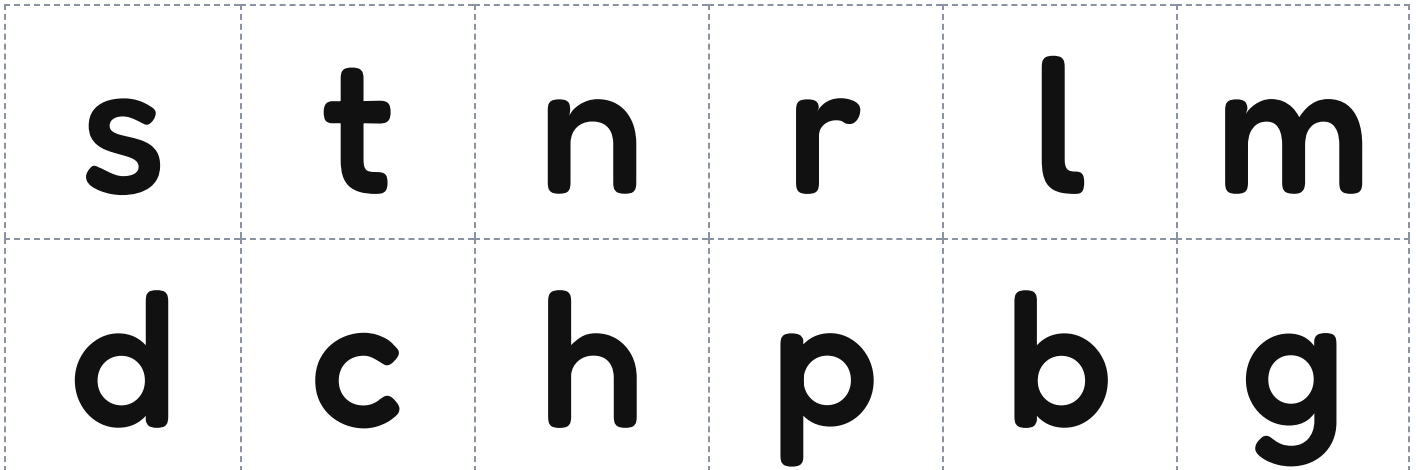

Spare tiles, for words that use the same sound twice — mommy, teeth, little, banana. Cut along the dotted lines.

✂ **Extra vowels** The tiles a word runs out of first — teeth, moon, banana.



✂ **Extra consonants** mommy, little, puppy, kitten.



✂ **Extra vowel teams**



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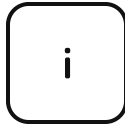
Elkonin Sound Boxes: How to Use Them

For the grown-up. Ten minutes, one word at a time — tonight's word from school, from a story, or your child's own name.

One box for each sound — not each letter

Four letters, **three sounds**. **sh** is one sound, so it takes one box. English does not let you count sounds by counting letters — which is exactly why the boxes help.

Do it together — five steps

1. **Adult** says the word slowly, stretching each sound. Mmm-aaa-p.
2. **Kid** puts a sound tile in a box for each sound they hear.
3. **Kid** touches each dot and says that sound on its own.
4. **Kid** sweeps along the arrow and blends the sounds.
5. **Kid** takes the tiles off and writes the word, saying each sound.

You are in every session. Step 1 is the whole scaffold — your child cannot pull a word apart into sounds until they hear it pulled apart. Say it again, slower, whenever they stall. Never spell it for them.

Worth knowing

- **No letters yet? Use the counters.** Same five steps, one counter per sound, no spelling. That is where a four-year-old starts.
- **Green to red.** The dots and the arrow are the direction the word is read — first sound on green, last on red.
- **Count sounds, not letters, to pick the page.** *up* → 2. *ship*, *rain* → 3. *frog* → 4. *stamp* → 5.
- **Two letters can be one sound.** *sh*, *ch*, *th*, *ck*, *ee*, *ai* and the doubles (*ll*, *ss*, *ff*) each take one box.
- **There is no q tile.** *q* never works alone — use *qu*. It says two sounds, /k/ and /w/, and most teachers keep it in one box.
- **x is two sounds**, /k/ and /s/. Let the *x* tile straddle two boxes, or use *k* and *s*.



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
